Learning highlights

Children in **Owlet Class** have listening to lots of traditional tales. They made props for Jack's cottage in the role play area, made a story map for Little Red Riding Hood, acted out and sang songs from Hansel and Gretel and some of us have written our own stories. Children in **Owl Class** had a fantastic trip to the Science Museum in London. We were fascinated by the size of the lunar lander, the scorch marks on the real Apollo 10 Command module and the Yuri Gagarin presentation. We especially liked our time in the Pattern Pod finding out about different patterns in nature.



Children in **Panda Class** have had an exciting start to the term using sketching techniques they learnt with a classroom visitor, to sketch their own impressive Dragons. We will continue to learn about dragons whilst reading 'How to Train your Dragon' as part of our book study. Children in **Rhino Class** have had a great day in the presence of a Viking warrior. They have learnt all about Viking raids, invasions, sagas and taken part in reconstructions of famous stories.

We are looking forward to an action packed term of events which started on Tuesday when children in Rhino class attended an exciting and very noisy sports hall athletics event at Langtree! The competition started with an obstacle relay and sprints before moving on to the field events and finished with a very exciting over and under race. School Council News

At the last three School Council meetings we have been busy discussing priorities in the School Development Plan. In December we discussed the priority “to develop the school as a learning community so that parents participate as partners in their children’s learning”. We conducted a survey of the School Council members in which we summarised parental involvement in reading, homework and the many other ways in which our parents support our learning in school. Last week we moved onto the priority “to produce an inspiring school curriculum which goes beyond statutory obligations”. Each year group thought about a Learning Project they had undertaken in Term 2 and we summarised what had worked well and what had not worked so well. Arrangements for Emergency Closure of the School

On rare occasions, for example during extreme weather conditions or when the school has no heating or water, the Headteacher and Chair of Governors may have to take the decision to close the school. It is school policy to keep the school open if at all possible, but there are occasions when it would not be possible to operate the school within the health and safety requirements.

In the very unlikely event of an emergency closure during the school day, the school will contact parents via the email contact details kept in school. All children will be kept safely until collected. Please ensure, therefore, that the school has your up-to-date daytime contact details.

In the event of an emergency closure before the start of the school day the school will notify Oxfordshire County Council and the local radio stations and will send a group email to all parents who receive the weekly newsletter. If parents need to find out whether or not the school is closed they should:

- Check their email and the school website
- Look on the county public website: www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/schoolclosures;
- Listen to the announcements of the local radio stations:
 - BBC Radio Oxford – VHF/FM 95.2
 - Heart FM (Oxfordshire) – VHF/FM 102.6
 - JACK FM – VHF/FM 106.8

Parents are advised not to call the radio stations otherwise switchboards can become jammed and prevent the radio stations receiving information from schools. Parents may attempt to call the school, but the school cannot guarantee that there will be someone in the office to man the phone.

Our hot school meals are prepared in the kitchen at Langtree School and delivered to Checkendon in time for lunch. Langtree School may be closed on days when Checkendon School is open. We ask therefore that, if there is snow on the ground but Checkendon School is open, parents assume that hot dinners will **not** be delivered, cancel their lunch online and send their child with a packed lunch.
