Professional Culture

So that we can all support effective time management and a prompt start to the school day, we encourage parents to make pre-arranged meetings with teachers. This allows teachers to prepare for the meetings and makes them more useful, it also ensures that confidential conversations are not overheard by others. Naturally, expectations about parental engagement change as pupils get older. When children are in Reception and KS1, parents may talk informally with staff members at the beginning and end of the school day. However, longer meetings or confidential discussions are usually pre-arranged at a convenient time usually after school. Once children are in KS2, meetings between teachers and parents are pre-arranged via the school office. There is no direct email communication between individual teachers and parents; all emails go through the school office. Thank you for your support

Fostering Independence

As the children grow older, they become more independent and we are keen to foster this developing independence. To clarify our expectations for the beginning and end of the day:

- Parents of children in Reception are expected to bring their children into the classroom and help them with bags and coats. At the end of the day, children are handed directly from the classroom into the care of a named adult.
- Parents of children in Key Stage 1 are encouraged to bring their children into the corridor and help them with bags and coats; they may accompany Year 1 pupils into the classroom. At the end of the day, children leave the allocated playground area into the care of a named adult.
- Parents of children in Year 3 and Year 4 may bring their children into the corridor and help them with bags and coats; they are not expected to go into the classroom. At the end of the day, children leave the classroom to locate their known adult on the playground; if this person is not there, they return to the care of the class teacher.
- Children in Year 5 and Year 6 are expected to enter the building independently; parents are not expected to go into the classroom. At the end of the day, children leave the classroom to locate their known adult on the playground; if this person is not there, they return to the care of the class teacher. Some children have written permission from their parents to walk/cycle home unaccompanied.

Plastic pollution is an issue highlighted by David Attenborough in his recent series *Blue Planet II* which the staggering scale of harm plastic waste has on the environment. It's not just life below the water that's affected - studies have shown up to 90% of seabirds have plastic in their digestive systems and microplastics (broken-down plastics which are eaten by filter feeders like plankton and in turn fish then humans) have been found in a range of edible products.
