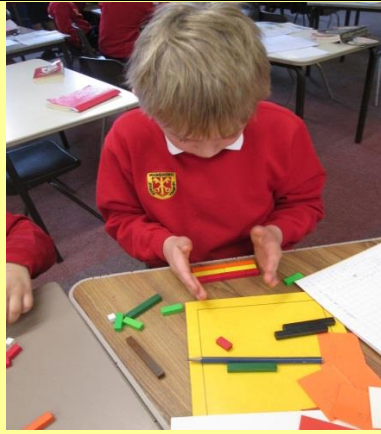

### Learning highlights this week...

Children in **Owlet Class** were visited by Pak the alien this week. Pak has been helping us learn our phonics and encouraging us to write. During independent learning, children have made space umbrellas and tested materials to see if they are waterproof. Children in **Owl Class** have been recovering from our visit to Tolhurst farm, where we planted garlic and broad beans. We are looking forward to going back to harvest them in the spring. We have also been out and about exploring the materials used to make the buildings in Checkendon. Children in **Panda Class** have made a great start learning how to use fractions this term. Great engagement and concentration making halves, quarters, thirds and fifths in different contexts. Can you make similar fractions at home?



Children in **Rhino Class** became archaeologists this week on their visit to the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford. They learned all about Anglo-Saxon artefacts and how they tell us about how the Anglo-Saxons lived. They were excited to see the famous Alfred jewel and the new display of the Watlington Hoard of silver items discovered in 2015. Their visit was a fantastic launch to their learning project.

On Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> November we had the biggest turnout so far for cross country at Langtree School with 32 children from Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 competing! Everybody showed great determination with a special mention to Tilly Crook who was the only Checkendon girl in the Year 3 and 4 Girls' race. Harvey Herbert gave a final spurt to be the top finisher in the Year 5 and 6 Boys' race. He received the medal for determination after a fantastic sprint finish. Well done to everyone who took part.

At school, we will be exploring the value **peace**, School Values Ambassadors will lead an assembly using resources from Picture News and children in Year 5 and Year 6 will take part in a county wide survey. School Value Ambassadors will also be touring the classes with a play to teach them about the value of respect.

On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November the whole school will get to see The Power of One anti-bullying show. It will show different bullying scenarios, bystander behaviours, and solutions to bullying. The message of the performance is that every child has the Power of One, the power to report and deal with bullying when they see it. There will be 2 performances, one for Reception to Year 3 and another for Year 4 to 6. The show is changed based on the age of the children in the audience.

## School Association Book Fair

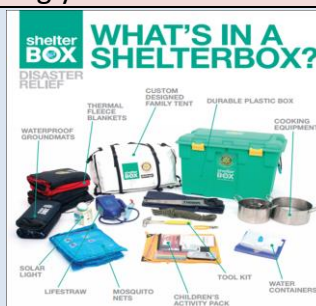
