## IMPACT OF PUPIL PREMIUM

### Annual Report to Parents & Guardians for 2012-13



The Pupil Premium is an element of school funding aimed at narrowing the gap in attainment between certain disadvantaged groups of pupils and those who are more well off. In 2012-13 funding was calculated on the basis of £600 for each pupil who has been eligible for free school meals in the past six years, and for looked after children in care for more than six months. There is a related Service premium of £250 for children of families in the armed services.

The funding is provided to schools, which decide how best to spend this according to local needs.

This year our school budget included a total Pupil and Service Premium of £1,857 (0.5% of our overall revenue budget), and below is a summary of the way we have used this funding to support our pupils' learning.
